Roya Assai Putting new life into her patients' smiles

It's been almost a decade since Roya Assai walked into PA for her first day as a dental assistant. Having just graduated from George Brown College with her Level II Dental Assisting Certification, it was time to take all that learning and put it to the test in the real world of a fast-paced dental practice. The change left Roya contemplating her career options. But a fractured crown turned out to be the best way to make a career decision. "With a fractured crown, I took my first step into a dental practice. It was impressive. The best healthcare for patients was the priority. When



speaking with the dentist who fixed my crown, we discussed my experience in healthcare as a midwife. He immediately recommended I pursue a career in dental hygiene. The rest is history."

"It really is the best situation I could imagine. I am a healthcare professional. I get to bring smiles to people's faces with my skills and our services. I love working at PA. It's my second home! The mutual trust and respect between myself and our dentists brings the best to our patients and makes everyday a pleasure. I can continue to bring the professionalism and high level of service to my career, just as I did at any stage from midwife to restorative hygienist. Rebuilding Haiti

PA is very proud of its efforts to raise funds to help the people of Haiti. Through staff and patient donations – and a generous dollar-for-dollar match from Dr. Barzilay – PA then had its funds matched by the Government of Canada. In all, well over \$2,000 was donated to Haiti through UJA of Toronto (IsraAid).

Israeli medical experts and rescue teams in Haiti have received praise from around the world for their intense lifesaving efforts at the IDF field hospital they set up in a soccer stadium in Port-au-Prince. They literally came from "the other side of the world" to set up the impressive field hospital within four hours of their arrival in Haiti.
