Now there is technology that can slow the rate at which telomeres shorten and, in some cases, even grow them back. This, in turn, can reverse genetic aging.

The programs at DeerFields Clinic target epigenetic (telomeres), hormonal and metabolic imbalances as well as focusing on the other key pillars of Age Management Medicine which include the DeerFields Diet, optimal exercise programs, and stress reduction.

Dr. Knipping has lectured on separate occasions at PA to our groups and to outside dentists. We are very excited about the incredible possibilities this treatment has the ability to accomplish.

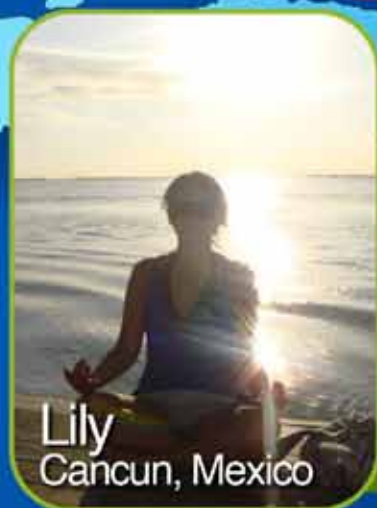
