Technology also facilitates better communication with our patients. Staying in touch with you has always been a top priority for PA. Through the use of DemandForce, an application specifically designed to allow us to seamlessly communicate with our patients, we can easily connect directly with you. And now through social media we are able to stay in touch through Facebook, LinkedIn, and Twitter. Talk about a 21st Century practice! Here are just a few of the other technologies we employ at PA. There may be some intimidating words like lasers and collimators, but you can rest assured that the technology used at PA is the safest and most effective in the industry, and it all contributes to making your time at PA as comfortable as possible.

There was a time when getting impressions of your teeth was a time consuming and uncomfortable procedure. With the advent of digital scan-



ners we are able to significantly cut down on the time required in the dentist's chair. You might think of a laser scanner as a way of getting old photos onto your computer, but at PA

we use the iTero, True Definition and E4D Scanners to create incredibly exact impressions of your teeth. Replacing the messy 'paste and mould' method, scanners are able to quickly and accurately map out your mouth and instantly send the 3D impressions straight to our computers.

The use of lasers is one of the most transformative technologies in dentistry today. Lasers are used in both prosthodontic and periodontal treatments, as well as in dental hygiene visits for periodontal pocket reduction and cold sore treatment. Because they help to reduce bleeding, swelling and discomfort, lasers are also integral tools in many of the different surgical procedures offered at PA. In some cases lasers even allow the PA team to work without having to administer anesthesia. Our goal is always to provide a more laid back and relaxed experience for you, and lasers help us to achieve just that.

There are some technologies, like x-rays, that have stayed consistent over time. But even if we're using tried and true tools, we always have up-todate equipment, promoting a safer environment



for everyone at PA. That's right, even x-rays have gone digital. Our digital x-ray system, ScanX, allows us to project up to 90% less radiation than a



traditional x-ray. This, in conjunction with the Tru-Align laser aligning collimator, drastically reduces the amount of radiation released. A laser aligning collimator – that's quite a mouthful! A collimator is simply a device that narrows the beam of x-rays.

In turn, this tool ensures the images we take of your mouth are accurate, precise and clear.

If you've ever suffered occlusion issues (a problem with your bite), then you might be familiar with Tekscan, a system for computerized occlusal analysis. Tekscan maps out your unique bite pattern, and is used to identify on screen the precise areas in need of adjustment. Tekscan, a handheld device, is able to analyze your bite so we can quickly determine premature points of contact and minimize destructive forces. Tekscan makes



it easy for patients to visualize their occlusion problems and to understand the need for treatment. After all, it is always better to see something with your own eyes rather than having it explained using a lot of complicated medical terms. On

top of all that, the precision of the Tekscan technology reduces the need for follow-up appointments – and that's better for everybody. They say the first rule of real estate is 'location, location, location.' In fact, the same goes for dental implants. Simplant[®] is an implant placement planning software used at PA to give us exact information on the anatomy of your mouth. The planning software offered by Simplant[®] provides 3D views of your mouth, including the width and density of your jawbone and the exact location of neighboring tooth roots and nerves. With the precise information obtained by using Simplant[®] we are better able to determine the perfect location for your implants. This ensures the best results, and allows you to see exactly how your new teeth will look - before treatment has even begun!

Oral Cancer is an extremely serious disease that can sometimes be very difficult to detect. At PA we use the VELscope® Vx Enhanced Oral Assessment System, an oral cancer screening tool, to identify any abnormalities as early as possible. VELscope is a wireless, handheld scope that applies tissue fluorescence to your mouth, highlighting any concerns - often months or even years before they may become visible to the naked eye. As with all cancers, early detection is key to increasing the chances of successful treatment.
